All in all we are pleased that we have given the ladies a different mindset of riding motorcycles, hopefully we will see more girls buying motorcycles.




EASTER SPORT FESTIVAL – APRIL 2014

Motorcycle Riding & Safety Tip Training was hosted by Biker Safe Motorcycle Academy with a total of 6 ladies participating.

The Live to Race Passenger Hot Laps was very popular and we combined it with a charity drive, there was a total of 45 participants, consisting of ladies of the public, media and ladies from Pink Drive participate in passenger laps. \pm 15 Reach for a Dream children were also present on the day.

A special day at the races breakfast was hosted for 39 ladies and 8 8 ladies from the Media attended a special 'Media Challenge' on the day.

The **BIGGEST** success story leading up to the event, was the **amazing journey of Carri-Anne Jane**! Carri-Anne is a freelance motoring journalist and visits the Wiele2Wiele radio studio of Tygerberg 104fm and GROOTfm 90.5 often. During one recording for our '2-Wiele' motorcycling programme, Carri-Anne mentioned 'tongue in cheek' that she knows nothing about bikes and would love to learn how to ride a motorcycle. Carri-Anne Jane tells her story:

It started with a love of F1 at age 4, by age 5 I'd been banned from riding my bicycle as my parents deemed me too reckless. Word on the street is someone had seen me flying down the biggest hill in our

little town, hair flying, legs stretched out horizontal with the ground. I remember with clarity, I loved the thrill of the speed and two wheels.

Growing up I watched with envy as my brothers were allowed scramblers to muck about on. I substituted horsepower for a horse with power, once again the allure of speed and the harmony of woman and beast attracting me.

At 15 F1 lost the attraction as I discovered the allure of MotoGP and I was hooked, enquiring as to the possibility of a motor bike under the Christmas tree was met with stony faced silence.

At 18 I got my drivers and as much as I loved it, I was still envious of every bike that passed me on the road.

At 29 I got the opportunity to learn to ride a bike. I grabbed it with both hands and feet. Thanks to Jeanette and Carl at Tygerberg 104FM, Deon Cilliers of Bike Parts Online and the ever patient teacher of



Billy de Beer from Biker Safe Motorcycle Training Academy, I finally got to realise my dream. In my world of shoes and handbags women don't ride bikes nor do they want too. Finding a team willing to help me was the scariest and most exhilarating thing I've ever done, and I've done some stupid stuff.

My challenge was set by Deon, to learn to ride a bike and make it around the track in an open session at Killarney

Women's Day event on Saturday, 16 August 2014.

Riding wasn't as hard as it looked and within the safe parameters of Billy's tutelage I 'got' it. And it bit me back. Even doing my meagre 10km p/hour speed I knew I was hooked, this was what I'd always dreamt it would be like. By the time the Women's Day Event arrived I was anxious and excited and amazed. It was amazing to see the amount of women on their bikes, some for the first time in years going around the track. What was even better was the camaraderie sheer strangers showed towards me from big burly muscle clad men and their superbikes to every person on the track giving me the thumbs up on my laps.

I'll be back next year, hopefully with an entourage with shoes and handbags that will be making their bike riding dreams come true. A huge thank you to all the sponsors and a very special thank you to the FIM for once again making this day possible.
